

city's airfield are other key contributors of the spiral rise of particulate emission in 2017." Ms. Jyoti further added that "While keeping the urgency of the situation in mind, the state government should chalk out an affirmative 'Clean Air Action Plan'. The action plan should identify a set of action priorities as per emission source, recognised regulations, and should also include institutional arrangement that will set it on track to mitigate pollution. It is essential for the city to have a source apportionment study in order to understand the emission profile of each of the polluting sectors."

Besides, Bihar should work out a targeted action plan to reduce emissions from all sources, and stringent measures should be employed to clean the ambient air. CEED urges the Bihar Government to take concrete measures to improve the air quality of the city.
