The Task Force on Sustainable Just Transition

The Task Force on Sustainable Just Transition has been constituted by The Government of Jharkhand (dated: 09.11.2022) and Green Hydrogen (dated: 17.03.2023) by bringing together various government departments and other stakeholders to assess, estimate and develop recommendations for a wide spectrum of issues related to the energy transition.

Structure

Thematic Framework

In order to achieve the net-zero goal and create an enabling framework for sustainable transition, the following thematic areas are identified as important to support the transition process in the state.



Key Deliverables



An Alternate and Viable Livelihood Plan: Development of a state livelihood action plan for the identification of new opportunities and assessment of alternative green jobs.



Energy Transition Roadmap: Development of a pathway through assessment of the demand-supply gap, resource assessment and energy modelling to ensure long-term energy security for the state.



The Carbon-Neutrality Roadmap: Development of a cross-sectoral decarbonisation framework that will ensure a low-carbon development pathway.



Green Hydrogen Roadmap: Development of a roadmap for implementing green Hydrogen mission and establishment of an ecosystem to support the transition process.



State Sustainable Mobility Roadmap: A plan to revamp the mobility sector by focusing on deep electrification, enabling infrastructure and policy intervention to decarbonise the sector.



Sustainable Coal Transition Roadmap: Framework of the coal transition to identify and attract greener livelihood opportunities through the repurposing, reclamation, and rehabilitation of coal mines.



Investment and Finance Mechanism: Dedicated strategy for sustainable finance to attract international funding, support SDGs, foster green technology innovation and create employment opportunities.



Institutional Framework for Sustainable Transition: To create capacity development programmes and centres of excellence to support the transition process.



Task Force, Sustainable Just Transition, Government of Jharkhand

The Government of Jharkhand has established a Task Force on Sustainable Just Transition to support national climate goals of achieving net-zero emissions by 2070 along with addressing associated socio-economic issues. The Task Force aims to provide key recommendations to the Government of Jharkhand on the sustainable transition for a future- ready Jharkhand by identifying innovative pathways for transitioning to a non-fossil fuel-based ecosystem, assessing the impact on the economy, workers, and communities, identifying opportunities in green sectors, and recommending policy interventions.

Centre for Environment and Energy Development (CEED)

The Centre for Environment and Energy Development (CEED), an environment and energy expert group, is involved in creating sustainable solutions to maintain a healthy, rich, and diverse environment.
